Ron Johnson is Vice President, CIO/CTO, Vice Provost and faculty member at the University of Washington. He has played a major role in each generation of national, regional and state networks. He and his teams have brought advanced messaging technologies (including PINE & IMAP); applications (such as real-time on-demand TV); and, “extreme” content (such as uncompressed high definition TV and cinema), to the Internet. Currently, in addition to serving as a co-principal investigator on cyber-infrastructure oriented contracts and grants, Ron is also a founder of, and leader in: the National LightRail effort; the Pacific NorthWest GigaPoP (including the Pacific Wave international exchange); Washington State’s K-20 network; and the ResearchChannel. Ron is a founding Participant in GLIF, a director on a number of boards including IEEAF, CENIC, KEXP-FM, the ResearchChannel; and a regular member of panels and advisory boards such as Internet2’s Network Planning and Policy Council and NSF’s Teragrid/DTF Advisory group.
