**Jefferson Lab Governor's Distinguished CEBAF Professors (GDGP)
&
Governor's CEBAF Scientists (GCS)**

Since the early days of the Jefferson Lab, the mid 80's, the Commonwealth of Virginia has supported the appointment and financing of five laboratory Governor's Distinguished CEBAF Professors (GDGP's) and four Governor's CEBAF Scientists (GCS's). The holders of these appointments are full time employees of the Jefferson Lab. In the case of the GDGP's they also hold tenured faculty appointments at a Virginia public university. The GCS's may or may not hold faculty appointments (no tenure commitments).

The Commonwealth offered these appointments as a means of attracting and retaining top-flight candidates for key positions at the Jefferson Lab

The Commonwealth has appropriated funds each year to the laboratory—now back at to the level of \$1 million-- to assist in paying for these positions. However the use of these funds is not limited by the appropriation language and has been used, at least in part, for immediate high priority needs of the laboratory that could not be funded from other sources such as the FEL program.

With lab turnover the number of holders of the GDGP and GCS appointments has varied from the full nine authorized by the Commonwealth to as few as four. The current holders of the GDGP's positions are Christoph Leemann (at UVA), Anthony Thomas (at W&M), and Lawrence Cardman (at UVA). Holders of the GCS's positions since the early days of these appointment are Peter Kneisel, Accelerator R&D and Claus Rode, Project Management (both at VaTech).

Candidates for these positions are nominated by the Director of the Jefferson Lab to the President of SURA who negotiates with representatives of individual Commonwealth universities involved to obtain agreement on appointments. These universities are the University of Virginia, Virginia Tech, Virginia Commonwealth, Old Dominion and William and Mary.
